The 2007 Georgia Winnie Rebels State Rally "A Western Roundup" has closed and now recorded in the history books! We had 110 coaches attend along with a varied group of vendors, making this a successful rally. The rally was held at the Georgia Fair Grounds and Agra-center, located in Perry, GA. A large group of friends from Florida attended, along with 10 other states being represented in addition to Georgia.

The rally officially began on Thursday afternoon at 2:00 p.m.. The opening ceremony featured a color guard from a local high school presenting the flags and a warm welcome from Mayor James Worrall.

We had a fine complement of vendors providing both goods and services to the attendees. At the top of the list was John Bleakley Motor Homes, who provided coaches for viewing and for sale along with service technicians to take care of emergency repairs. Blue Ox provided free "tune-ups" for existing Blue Ox tow bars and Rally's R Us was seen all over the park. Coaches were being washed and detailed, carpets were being cleaned and folks were buying new name tags, veteran items, etc. A major run was made on the WIT store, buying new jackets, shirts, and hats.

The main hall for the rally had a large "Hee Haw" style barn center stage, providing the focal point of the room. Tables and walls were decorated in a western motif with cowboy hats, deputy badges and "wanted" posters featuring pictures of many members of the state club. A hearty thanks to the Huelsbeck's for the design and building of the barn and the Tomsett's for the table and wall decorations.

In addition to typical seminars being provided, special emphasis was given to the ladies this year, including a craft seminar (36% of the ladies attended) and a ladies driving class was conducted with 31 women completing the class representing 56% of the ladies at the rally!
