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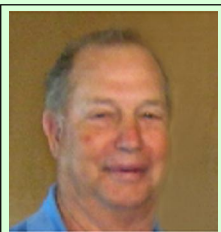
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### A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

Kennedy, Sarah and Roy Sowers' granddaughter, was afraid she would drop her ice cream as she went down the steps.

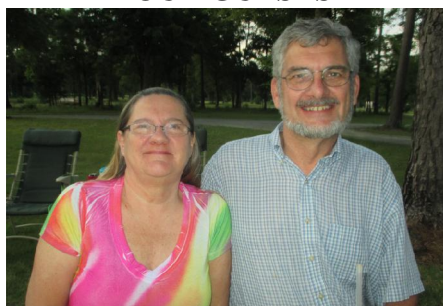


New Sta-Goner member Cathie Lusted visited with Karen Sidlauskas while eating ice cream on the front porch of the club house.
