made up of scrambled eggs, bacon, pancakes, applesauce and orange juice – they were delicious! It was this breakfast where we made our plans for the day.





and off the tower we flew!


Over the river and through the woods,



You must now make your reservation for your camp site for the days that you want to attend the rally directly with Bald Mountain Camping Resort at <http://www.baldmountainpark.com> or 706-896-8896. The campground is open for reservations full-time from April 1st to Oct. 30th and closed from Nov. 1st to Jan. 2nd. They will reopen for reservations only on Jan. 3rd, Monday through Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. eastern. The sites that are reserved for the rally will only be held until March 1st. The charge will be the prevailing rate minus 10% (tax included) per day per campground site. The RV resort's policy is as follows; one night deposit to be paid when you make your reservation. They have a 7 day cancellation policy and a \$6 cancellation fee. After you arrive you pay your balance in full. There are no refunds for early check out. Check in is at 1:00 p.m. and check out is at 12:00 p.m.
