

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Macaroni Salad

1 box tiny shell macaroni
1 cup chopped celery
1/2 cup chopped onion
1/2 teaspoon celery seed
1 very small container pimientos
1/2 very small can LeSueur baby peas
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1/2 cup chopped black olives
1/3 cup (more or less) juice from sweet pickles or bread & butter pickles

Cook and drain macaroni. Mix mayonnaise and pickle juice. Add all ingredients together and chill. You can later add (if you wish) chopped cooked chicken, or a can of baby shrimp, or chopped cooked ham. This would make a cool meal for a hot day.
