PEANUT BUTTER BALLS

1 C. Graham Cracker Crumbs
2 Sticks Margarine, Melted
1 - 7 oz. Jar Marshmellow Cream
1 C. Finely Chopped Pecans
1 Can (3-1/2 oz.) Coconut
1 C. Peanut Butter (either kind)
1 tsp. Vanilla Flavoring
1 Box Powdered Sugar
Mix together, shape into balls and chill.
Melt together over low heat or double
boiler: 1 cake paraffin and 2 (12 oz. pks)
semi-sweet chocolate chips. Dip chilled
balls in chocolate and place on wax
paper. Makes approx 50 balls.
