

Problem: Your autopark light comes on and will not go off. There are two sending units on a GM or Workhorse chassis that could cause a problem. Both of these sending units are located next to the autopark reservoir which is located under the RV. The first one screws into the reservoir for the fluid level; the second which is just behind the first unit regulates the autopark light on the instrument panel.

your car keys could save your life?

Put your car keys beside your bed at night. If someone tries to get into your house or motor home, just press the panic button for your car. The alarm will be set off and the horn will continue to sound until either you turn it off or the car battery dies.

Next time you come home at night and start to put your keys away, think of this: It is a security alarm system you probably already have and requires no installation. Test it - it will go off from almost anywhere inside your house and will keep honking until your battery runs down, or until you reset it with the button on the key fob chain.

It works when you park in your driveway or garage.

And remember to carry your keys in a parking lot.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Mother's Day Cream Puffs (With a dreamy cream filling)

1 cup water
1/2 cup butter
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 cup sifted all-purpose flour
4 large eggs, beaten
Creamy Vanilla Filling (below)
Confectioners' sugar

In large a saucepan, bring water, butter, and salt to a full rolling boil. Reduce heat, quickly stir in flour, mixing vigorously with a wooden spoon. Continue mixing until batter leaves the sides of the pan and forms a ball. Remove from heat and add beaten eggs a little at a time (about 6 additions), beating with an electric hand mixer after each addition until batter is smooth.

Drop dough from large metal spoon onto greased baking sheets forming 12 to 16 mounds about 3 inches apart. Bake at 400 degrees for 35 to 45 minutes. Transfer immediately to racks to cool away from drafts. When completely cooled, split and fill with Creamy Vanilla Filling and sprinkle with confectioners' sugar or frost with thin chocolate icing if desired.

Creamy Vanilla Filling

3 cups milk
3/4 cup sugar
6 tablespoons cornstarch
1/2 teaspoon salt
3 eggs, beaten
1 tablespoon butter
2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Scald milk in top of double boiler over boiling water. Mix sugar, cornstarch and salt, stir into scalding milk. Cook, stirring constantly until thick. Cover and cook for 10 minutes longer. Add a small amount of hot mixture to beaten eggs, return to the mixture in double boiler. Cook for 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Add butter. Put in bowl and sprinkle small amount of sugar over top to prevent skin from forming. Chill well, add vanilla. Spoon into Cream Puffs.

Note: This is the same recipe as for Eclairs. The only difference is that you pipe the dough into finger shapes and then bake.
