Double Layer Pumpkin Pie

- oz. cream cheese, softened
- tablespoon milk

- 1 tablespoon white sugar 1 - 1/2cups frozen whipped topping, thawed
 - (9-inch) prepared graham cracker crust
- 1 cup cold milk
- 1 (3.5 oz.) can solid pack pumpkin puree
- teaspoon ground cinnamon 1
- 1/2teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4teaspoon ground cloves

Directions: In a large bowl, whisk together cream cheese, 1 tablespoon of milk, and sugar until smooth. Gently stir in whipped topping. Spread into bottom of crust.

Pour 1 cup of milk into large bowl and thoroughly mix in pudding mix, pumpkin, cinnamon, ginger, and cloves. When thickened, spread over cream cheese layer.

Refrigerate 4 hours, or until set. Serves 8.

America The Beautiful AMERICA'S NORTH COAST

We left Grand National 2007 headed to the North Shore of Minnesota. Lake Superior's breathtaking shore is simply magic. The North Shore drive hugs the water's edge for 154 miles. Grab a guide to the scenic drive and enjoy the outstanding scenic opportunities, sprinkled with historic attractions and dotted with friendly communities. Most of the experiences can only be

felt, not spoken. Lake Superior isn't shy. The wild beauty is evident in the spectacle of the rocks, the pounding waves and the endless, endless water and where silence replaces the sounds of traffic and day-to-day commotion.

Then on to Lake Michigan via Michigan's Upper Peninsula where the lakeshores were bursting with activity with the thought of summer's end nearing. We crossed the five-mile long green and ivory engineering marvel Mackinac Bridge again. Years ago we crossed the bridge and visited Mackinac Island and enjoyed the Lake Huron side. So in August, we headed to the Lake Michigan side to the cherry capitol of the world, enjoying quaint towns, the markets, beaches, historic sites and the giant dunes.

The Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore, a 71,000-acre park, spans a 35-mile curve of Lake Michigan shore south of Leland and offers a relaxing, recreational and inspirational visit. Among the park's treasures are North American's largest fresh water sand dunes towering 460 feet above Lake Michigan. The diverse landscape embraces birch-lined streams, dense beech-maple forests, sandy beaches, rugged, glacially formed bluffs, and many small lakes. Park Headquarters are at Empire to the South. There are maps with scenic drives taking you to spectacular overlooks without a lot of walking.
