The last two digits in the code tell you what year the tire was made. Knowing what year they were manufactured will give you a clue as to when they need replacing even if they still have tread. The rule of thumb for replacement is 5-7 years.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH By Betty Werner



GAZPACHO ANDALUZ

1 clove garlic, 1 med. onion, 6 fresh tomatoes, peeled, 1 green pepper, 1 cucumber, peeled and seeded, 1/2 tsp. salt, 1/2 tsp. pepper, 2 tbsp. wine vinegar, 2 tbsp. olive oil and dash of hot pepper sauce or pinch of cayenne.

Put all ingredients in a blender and give it a whirl until all is liquified. Chill for several hours and serve with additional of any or all of the vegetables chopped and/or croutons for garnish.

Hint: You can use 3 fresh tomatoes and a 15 oz. can of stewed tomatoes.
