Have you checked the roof seams along the gutter recently?

For those that have looked up on the top of their side walls, you will notice you have a rain gutter. Now for those who have not gotten up on a ladder and checked that area of their motor home, I would suggest you do so (no matter how old your motor home is). The fiberglass roof wraps over the top of your motor home and is tucked down behind the rain gutter by just about an inch. As most know, an inch is not much distance. There is usually a clear seal (probably clear caulk) that is run along this gutter/roof connection. For all intent and purposes, it appears to me that that seal is about all that is holding that fiberglass roof in place. I found that in my case, this seal was not doing much sealing anymore. When I pushed in on the fiberglass roof material, I could see it give and there was then a gap between it and the gutter. When this occurs, water will run through the gap and into your sidewalls. In my case it was running down and exiting out the window by the driver. I had looked and looked and sealed the cap and window trying to stop that leak. It wasn't until I happened to put my hand down on the roof lip and saw it move opening the gap that I realized where the water was coming from. I then resealed the whole length of the motor home and so far no more leak. So check that area from time to time so you don't have fresh water available from your drivers window (grin)!
