Winter is Here !!

As those that made the Gadsden meeting are aware, Winter has arrived. Make sure that you have the proper amount of anti-freeze in your cooling system. If you are not going to use your Motor Home this winter, be sure to winterize it or you might have some nasty shocks come Spring.

For those that will be doing things with your Motor Home all Winter long, please do not forget that those pesky water lines run under your floors in the bay areas (some might even be on the outside of the vehicle). It is nice to use a small electric heater inside the coach so the big unit does not have to run, but this will not always keep your water pipes warm and they can freeze on you. The gas furnace helps keep some heat in the bays on really cold nights and can sure save some big damage. I keep a small ceramic heater with a thermostat and fan on it plugged up in the bays at all times. This keeps air circulating in the bays and helps keep things warm as well as the humidity from getting too high down there.

I am sure that many folks have had their water pump freeze on a really cold night as well. I try to keep a shop light on in the water compartment on those cold nights and that seems to be just enough extra warmth to keep the cold critters at bay. I also wrap my water hose with the foam insulation you get at Home Depot or Lowes for wrapping water pipes in your home. This usually works pretty good down to the low teens but below that it is probably best to just unhook that water hose and store it till things warm up a bit.

Hope everyone has a warm and safe Winter. See you in the Spring.
