Sunday morning the group was treated to breakfast followed by a short business meeting. Good-byes were said and everyone headed for home.

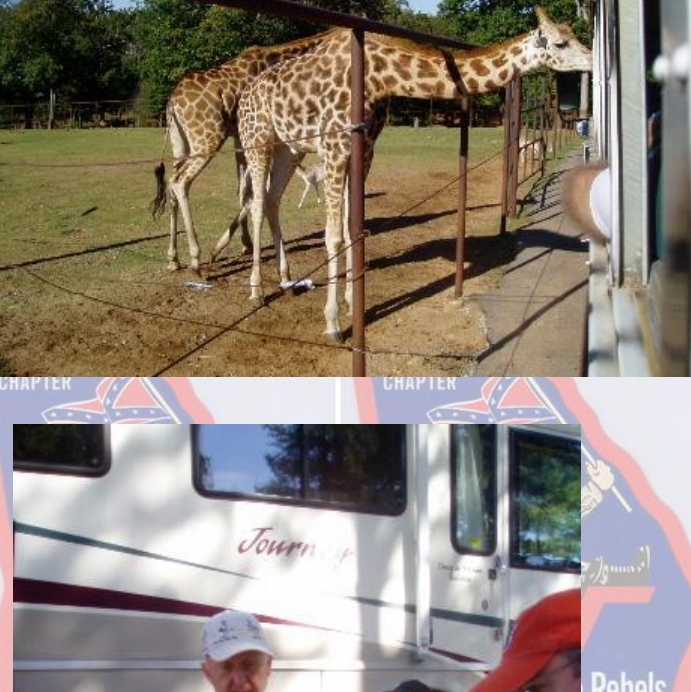

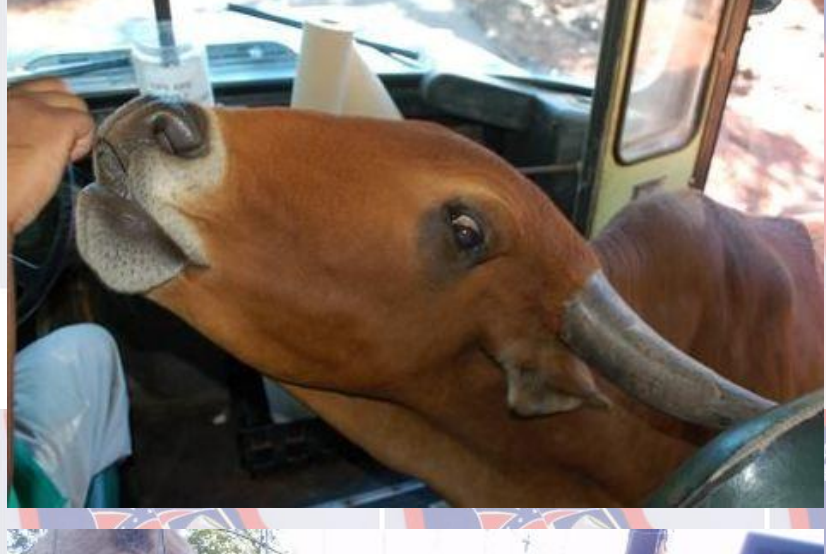
