Saturday morning started with pancakes and syrup, sausages, juice and coffee. Following we had our business meeting and were free for lunch and the afternoon.


Saturday evening we were treated to homemade spaghetti, sauce, meatballs, plain and garlic bread, salads, and all kinds of desserts. It was great!
