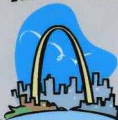

DID YOU KNOW . . .



that you can open your locked car with your cell phone?

Have you ever locked the keys in your car? If you lock your keys in the car and your spare keys are home, call someone who is at home on your cell phone.

Hold your cell phone about a foot from your car door and have the other person at your home press the unlock button, holding it near the phone on their end.

Your car will unlock. This saves someone from having to drive your keys to you.

Distance is no object. You could be hundreds of miles away, and if you can reach someone who has the other "remote" for your car, you can unlock the doors (or the trunk!).

Killarney Lime Bundt Cake

1 pkg white cake mix
1 pkg lime gelatin
3 eggs
1/3 Cup chopped pecans (optional)
2/3 Cup of oil and
2/3 Cup of water

Combine cake mix and gelatin in large bowl. Add eggs, oil and water - mix together. Fold in chopped pecans.

Sprinkle greased bundt pan generously with sugar. Bake in 350 degree oven for approximately 40 minutes. Check for doneness. Let cool about 10 minutes and invert on plate.

Glaze

Mix 1/2 cup of orange juice and 2/3 cup sugar in saucepan. Let come to a rolling boil for 1 minute. Cool - brush glaze on top and sides of cake.

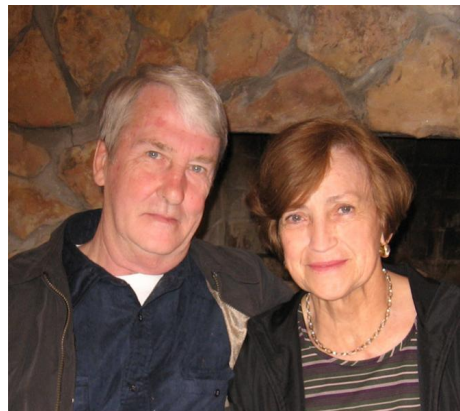
